This will provide those who receive funding, an in-person opportunity to showcase their mission, successes and plans moving forward at the American Legion in Barre on Saturday, April 6th from 11 a.m. – 1 p.m.

COMMUNITY GRANT CRITERIA

To be eligible for a Community Grant, an organization must submit a completed application by deadline and:

- Be classified as a 501(c)(3), be under the fiscal sponsorship of a 501(c)(3), be a program of a 501(c)(3) -or- be a public school;
- Address one of Rotary International's '7 Areas of Service' with the funded project from a Barre Rotary grant: Basic Education and Literacy; Disease Prevention and Treatment; Water, Sanitation and Hygiene; Community Economic Development; Maternal and Child Health; Supporting the Environment; Peace-building and Conflict Prevention;
- > Support residents in Barre City and/or Barre Town;
- Attend the Inaugural Barre Rotary Pie for Brunch and Community Awards Ceremony on <u>Saturday, April 6th from 11 a.m. – 1 p.m.</u> if chosen to receive a grant (to both physically receive their check and to table at the event) One representative will be invited to attend at no cost; additional attendees are welcome to attend at a discounted rate of \$5; any organization selected to receive a grant will be required to produce a Power Point slide or two depicting the services of the organization, and more specific criteria of the slide will be provided in advance. Additionally, grantees will also be invited and strongly encouraged to conduct an educational presentation at a future Barre Rotary meeting – to be scheduled based on mutual availability.

<u>Please note</u>: We <u>do not</u> provide community grants to organizations that promote religious doctrine, though we may support agencies operated by religious organizations that serve secular needs. We also do not award community grants to organizations that lack written policies about discrimination or have a track record of discriminating on the basis of age, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, ethnicity, disability, national origin, political affiliation or religious belief.
